

# Currently China's total solar power generation

How much solar power does China have in 2023?

China added almost twice as much utility-scale solar and wind power capacity in 2023 than in any other year. By the first quarter of 2024, China's total utility-scale solar and wind capacity reached 758 GW, though data from China Electricity Council put the total capacity, including distributed solar, at 1,120 GW.

How big is China's solar & wind power capacity?

How big is China's solar energy capacity in 2020?

In 2020, China saw an increase in annual solar energy installations with 48.4 GW of solar energy capacity being added, accounting for 3.5% of China's energy capacity that year. 2020 is currently the year with the second-largest addition of solar energy capacity in China's history.

China's renewable energy capacity, especially that of wind and solar, has witnessed rapid growth since the implementation of its Renewable Energy Law on 1 January 2006. By the end of 2016, the total installed capacity of wind and solar power in the country had reached 169 GW and 78 GW respectively, in both cases the largest of any country in the world.

As shown in Figure 1, by the end of 2019, the total installed capacity of nonrenewable energy power generation in China was 1214.62 GW, accounting for 60.5% of the total installed capacity; the total installed capacity of renewable energy power generation was 794.8 GW, an increase of 8.6% year-on-year, accounting for 39.5% of the total installed ...

By the end of 2017, the total installed capacity of China's solar photovoltaic power generation connected to the power grid was 1300 times of the data of 2007, with an averaged annual growth rate 104%. The newly installed capacity of PV power station is highest in 2017, and the growth rate of the newly installed capacity reached 302.08% in 2010.

China has led the world in solar power deployment every year since 2015. 46. In 2021, 53 GW of solar power capacity was added in China--40% of the global total. 47 At year end, total solar power capacity reached 307 GW. 48. In the first half of 2022, roughly 31 GW of solar power were added to the grid in China. 49

The newly installed capacity of PV is increasing every year, from 0.02 GW in 2007 to 53.06 GW in 2017. Centralized PV facilities are the primary form of China's PV power generation application system.
