The battery is charged by using excess electricity to power crane motors which lift concrete blocks. The higher a block is lifted, the more potential energy it has stored.

The battery is situated within Voltalia's Toco energy storage complex, touted as one of the largest ones of its kind in France with a capacity of 19 MW/27 MWh. At present, Voltalia operates 48 MW of solar, hydropower, biomass and energy storage assets in French Guiana. The firm started building Parc Sable Blanc in November 2011.
