Why is Burundi launching a solar PV plant?

The pioneering 7.5 MW solar PV plant has increased Burundi's generation capacity by over 10%, and is the country's first substantial energy generation project to go online in over three decades, supplying clean power to tens of thousands of homes and businesses - just before the start of COP26. Construction of Mubuga solar power plant in Burundi resumes. Construction works on Mubuga solar power plant in Burundi have resumed after almost 2 years of non-activity according to project developers Gigawatt Global. The project is being built in the Mubuga district in the eastern province of Gitega, one of the world's least-developed states.

Energy Situation Solar Energy. Solar energy is the most common off-grid electricity source in Burundi, although the number of systems installed is very slow. With the global price dropping of solar technologies a small solar sector emerged in the recent years, that offer smaller systems for private households, businesses and public institutions.
