With over 2 million solar power installations distributed in the entire U.S., many people may have growing concerns over fire safety. And that poses the question, can solar panels cause fires? Remarkably, solar panel system fires are rare. Nevertheless, many homeowners and business owners like to be informed of all the risks, including solar panel fires.

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The analysis put the annual fire incident rate at 28.9 fires per GW of PV panel generation capacity. As an estimate, this could result in 150 rooftop fires caused by PV panels in the UK in 2024. A worldwide figure that statistically could grow to up to two million fires by 2050 if projected PV panel growth rates are realized.

If you have a solar panel on your roof, there's a good chance it will get hotter than normal in direct sunlight. There is no official percentage of how solar panels catch fire, but it is around 0.006%, according to a German company that installs rooftop solar. This means that it's very unlikely that your PV will catch fire.

The risk of a solar panel catching fire is still very low, but it's not zero. Solar panel fires can be caused by improper installation or maintenance, arc faults and faulty wiring or from extreme weather events, such as hail or lightning, or as suspected in the case in Bristol - birds. In the USA, one of the biggest issues has been arc faults.

PV rooftop fires have been caused by electrical arcs that occurs near the combiner box, where numerous wires from PV panels are connected. This is a location where there is considerable voltage, before the current is converted from DC to AC at the inverter, and where the roof assembly could ignite and result in fire spread under the PV panels.
