Should Pakistan expand solar and wind power?

Solar and wind power should be urgently expanded to at least 30 percent of Pakistan's total electricity generation capacity by 2030, equivalent to around 24,000 Megawatts. Expanding renewable energy can make electricity cheaper, achieve greater energy security, reduce carbon emissions, and help Pakistan save up to \$5 billion over the next 20 years.

How does the project support the energy transition in Pakistan?

The project supports the energy transition with the following measures: Supporting institutions in the Pakistani energy industry to adopt regulatory requirements, policy guidelines, or instruments for implementing the Renewable Energies Strategy.

Will Pakistan be able to generate 60 percent of energy from renewable sources?

According to the revised RE policy, the Government of Pakistan aims to derive 60 percent of its energy from renewable sources including hydro by 2030 to wean Pakistan's dependence on imported fuel products. Pakistan has considerable potential for using wind energy in the coastal belt of Sindh and Baluchistan (in southern Pakistan).

Why did Pakistan decide to develop wind power energy sources?

The government of Pakistan decided to develop wind power energy sources due to problems supplying energy to the southern coastal regions of Sindh and Balochistan, the project was undertaken with assistance from the government of China. Another area with potential is Swat which shows good wind conditions in wind power investment.

How many solar power plants are there in Pakistan?

There have been some efforts to install and expand the use of solar energy in Pakistan. The average amount of daily sunlight in Pakistan is eight and a half hours [citation needed]; there are a few cloudy days even in the wettest regions. What is Pakistan's energy source?

According to the National Electric Power Regulatory Authority's (NEPRA) 2021 yearly report, Pakistan's total installed power generation capacity is 39,772 MW. Of this, 5.4% comes from renewable sources, such as wind, solar, and biomass. The remaining 94.6% comes from other sources, including 63% from thermal (fossil fuels), 25% from hydro, and 6.5% from nuclear.

Solar power entered Pakistan's energy mix in 2013 after the government introduced a set of support policies to foster renewable energy development. According to the Private Power & Infrastructure Board (PPIB) of the Ministry of Energy, seven solar projects of 530 MW are operational and supplying electricity to the national

grid.
