

Photovoltaic panels on the roof of a flat building

Solar photovoltaic panels or modules that are designed to be the roof, span to structural supports and have accessible/occupied space underneath shall have the panels or modules and all supporting structures designed to support a roof photovoltaic live load, as defined in Section CS507.1.1.1 (IBC 1607.13.5.1) in combination with other applicable loads.

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PV panels cover up to 33% of the total area in plan view (essentially, as seen from above), the panels must be at least 18 in. away from a horizontal ridge on both sides to create the 36-in.-wide path. Where panels cover more than 33% ...

Well, the answer is simple. The labour costs for flat roof solar panel installations is lower than a pitched roof. Approximately 10% of the cost of installing solar panel systems is attributed to the cost of labour and safety equipment. Solar panel installers have much more freedom to move on a flat surface.

Yes, it's okay to install panels on flat roofs. Panels on flat roofs are normally tilted up to help maximise energy production. It's important that the panels don't disturb the roof covering to keep it watertight. For this reason, many systems are weighted down rather than fixed through the roof covering.

Flat roof solar panel installation falls under permitted development so you shouldn't need to apply for planning permission. As long as your panels do not exceed the highest part of your roof, you should be fine.

If panels are to be fitted to a building in your garden or grounds they should not be visible from the highway. If being installed on a flat roof, solar panels are subject to the following conditions: panels cannot be sited within 1 metre of the external edge of the roof; or; panels cannot protrude more than 1 metre above the plane of the roof.
