Is Kazakhstan a good place to install solar power plants?

At least 50% of the territory of Kazakhstan is suitable for installing solar power plants(Antonov,2014). However,up until recently,solar resources of the country were not being used for power generation. Kazakhstan is developing solar energy technologies,namely production of photovoltaic modules using local silicon.

Is solar energy a viable energy source in Kazakhstan?

In 2019,another solar power plant in Kazakhstan,Saran,with a capacity of 100 MW started its operation in the Karaganda region (Satubaldina,2020). According to the International Energy Agency (IEA),within the period of 40 years,solar energy has a potential to meet about 20-25% of the energy demand of the country.

What is Kazakhstan's First Solar power plant?

The plant is to produce solar cells using Kazakhstan's silicon. The designed capacity of photovoltaic wafers is 50 MW with a potential to increase up to 100 MW. In 2012,the first solar power station,"Otar," that generates 0.5 MW of energy,was also built in the Zhambyl region.

How much solar power does Kazakhstan have?

In just five short years,solar power capacity has catapulted to 300 megawattsnationwide,and if you add other renewables like wind and hydropower,that number exceeds 700 megawatts,enough power to supply around 200,000 families in Kazakhstan. To understand just how remarkable this is,you have to know the context.

Can solar power drive Kazakhstan's Energy Transition?

However,Kazakhstan's solar ambitions do not fully tap into its potential,and the technology could play a far larger rolein the country's energy transition due to its low cost and flexibility. The focus now is on leveraging solar's comparative advantages to drive forward Kazakhstan's decarbonisation and harness its significant solar resources.

Where is Kazakhstan's new energy plant located?

It's located in Zhambyl,near Kazakhstan's border with Kyrgyzstan,an area known to be energy-poor but sunshine-rich. Difficult but necessary regulatory reforms were critical to getting the plant online. Using resources from the Climate Investment Funds and its partners,Kazakhstan introduced what's called a feed-in tariff on clean energy.

Solar Power: The potential of solar energy in Kazakhstan is estimated at 2.5 billion kWh per year. Solar energy can be widely used in two-thirds of Kazakhstan's territory. The government aimed to put 28 solar power plants into operation by the end of 2021, and met this goal, with currently 51 solar power plants in operation.

As of May 2020, the country had 97 renewable energy projects with a total capacity of 1,260 MW, with 19 more projects being approved by the government, nine of which were to be launched by December 2020 (Satubaldina, 2020).

In 2013, the Government of Kazakhstan adopted a new law, On Supporting the Use of Renewable Energy Sources. This promotes technology-specific feed-in tariffs for selected renewable energy technologies, such as biomass, solar, wind, geothermal and hydropower, up to 35 MW. [7] The cost of the programme is estimated at KZT 1,100 billion (c. EUR5.3 billion).

Balkhash Solar PV Park is a ground-mounted solar project which is planned over 140 hectares. The project is expected to generate 170,000MWh electricity and supply enough clean energy to power 100,000 households. The project is expected to offset 170,000t of carbon dioxide emissions (CO2) a year. The project cost is expected to be around \$118.189m.

It is the second photovoltaic project invested and constructed by Universal Energy in Kazakhstan, with an installed capacity of 30MWp. The project has been included in the list of "Key Projects of China-Kazakhstan Investment and Capacity Cooperation" and has been successfully connected to the grid in August, 2019.

Kaskelen 50MWp project is the third solar power project of Universal Energy in Kazakhstan. It started construction in 2019, and was connected to the grid on June 26, 2020. The project has been listed in Key Projects of China-Kazakhstan Capacity and Investment Cooperation. The completion of the project plays a positive role in the local economic ...
