

Snow covering the photovoltaic panels

If you have a rooftop system of rigid solar panels, leaving snow and ice covering the panel for too long prevents them from receiving as much sunlight and capturing as much of the sun's energy.

Snow Cover. Thick snow can cover your solar panels in a layer of snow, preventing light from reaching the PV cells. Accumulated snow can also add weight to the panels and decrease efficiency. However, heavy snow
