Uzbekistan is poised to launch solar and wind power stations with a total capacity of over 8,000 MW and hydropower stations with a capacity of 868 MW by 2026. 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The solar power station has a capacity of 220 kW. For comparison, the capacity of the smallest hydropower plant in Tajikistan - Varzob Hydropower Plant-3 is 3.52 MW, and the largest operating hydroelectric power plant - Nurek - 3000 MW and it generates 70% of electricity consumed in Tajikistan.
