Will a new solar plant increase energy demand in the Gambia?

Energy demand in The Gambia has increased by 5.5% per year in recent years and today's connection of the new 23 MWp solar plant to the national energy grid will significantly increase Gambia's current generation capacity of 98 MW and enable electrification of rural areas. A strong commitment

Is Gambia ready for a new era of renewables?

Gambia: strong international support for a new era of renewables with inauguration of historic 23 MWp solar plant A significant strategic project with strong substantial economic and social impacts, the recently inaugurated solar photovoltaic plant in Jambur is poised to supply electricity to approximately 18,500 households.

Will the Gambia build a solar farm in Soma?

The Gambia will build a 150 MW solar farm near the planned 250kV/30kV substation in Soma, to either upload power to stabilize the Gambian grid or for injection into the West African Power Pool or both, depending on conditions.

Why is NAWEC launching a solar plant in the Gambia?

This marks the first time in the Gambia's history where a utility scale solar plant of 23 Megawatts Solar PV capacity and 8-Megawatt hours battery storage is being commissioned. This solar plant allows NAWEC to finally shift away from expensive heavy fuel oil-based generation which is costly and harmful to the environment.

Will ECOWAS build a solar power station in Gambia?

In October 2022, a meeting was convened in Banjul, Gambia's capital city, in which representatives of the member countries of ECOWAS validated the feasibility study for the construction of the 150 MW Soma Solar Power Station, in Soma, Gambia.

The Soma Solar Power Station is a planned 150 megawatts solar power plant in Gambia. The two lead developers of this renewable energy infrastructure are the Government of Gambia and the Economic Community of West African States (ECOWAS). The World Bank and the European Investment Bank, have jointly committed US\$164 million in loans towards this development.

The Gambia entered a new era of energy development in April 2023 with the inauguration of its first



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large-scale solar energy facility in Jambur. Built by Chinese manufacturer Tebian Electric Apparatus, the 23 MW solar plant - equipped with an 8 MW electricity storage system - serves to reduce the country's reliance on imported fossil fuels.

The Gambian Ministry of Petroleum and Energy (MoPE) and the state-owned company Nawec have jointly launched an initiative tender for the construction of a 50 MW PV installation in Soma, south of the Gambia River. The PV plant is part of a 150 MW solar project under development since 2019 and expected to be coupled with unspecified battery ...

The project involves the Jambur photovoltaic solar power plant, the construction of which Afrik 21 announced would be launched in early 2023. Today the President of The Republic of The Gambia, His Excellency Adama Barrow inaugurated the historic 23MW solar plant with 8MWH battery storage in Jambur, Kombo North, West Coast Region.

The Project involves design, construction and operation of 12MW solar PV power plant at up to two sites by a single independent power producer (IPP); on the north and potentially south banks of the Gambia River connected to the grid. 2.1.2 The development of solar energy in The Gambia By virtue of its geographical location, The Gambia enjoys very good solar insolation throughout the year with slight seasonal variations. The average daily solar radiation ranges from 4.4 to 6.7 kWh/m2-- making solar energy the most prominent renewable energy resource of the country.

The Gambia Solar Energy Project - Initiated in 2007 and completed in 2012, this project was implemented by the University of Strathclyde's Department of Electronic and Electrical Engineering to provide sustainable lighting and energy to schools in rural Gambia. The project installed 8 solar energy systems by the time of its completion.



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
