If your main house roof is unsuitable (a thatched roof, for example), solar panels can instead be installed on a garage or other outbuilding.

Can solar panels be installed on a roof?

Your installers will usually need to erect scaffolding to install solar panels on your roof. Once this is up, solar panels can be installed in a day or two. The inverter will usually be fitted in either a loft or garage. This converts the DC your panels produce to AC that you can use in your home.

This is because a solar panel system usually weighs about 20kg per square metre, which the great majority of roofs can hold. However, flat roofs may not always be strong enough for solar panels.
